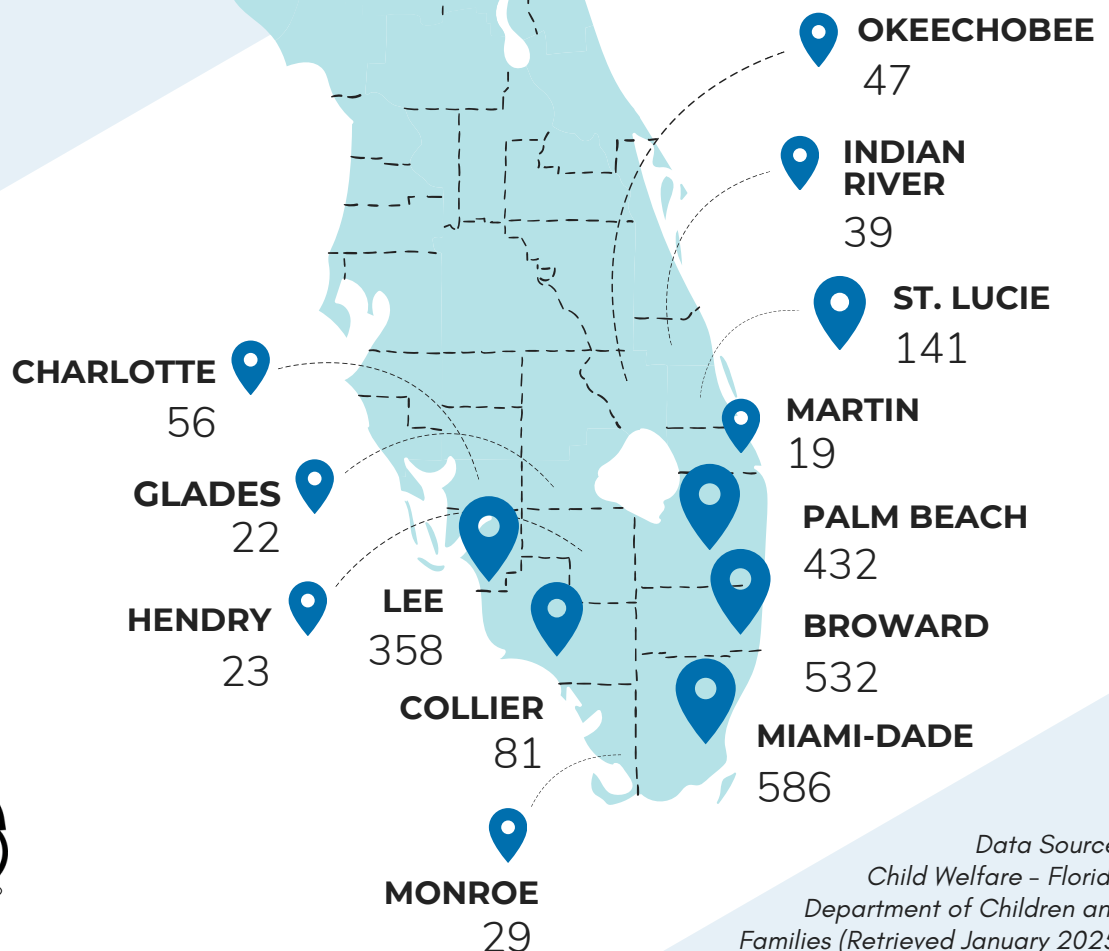


# KNOW THE FACTS

This map of Florida shows the number of kids who were removed from their homes between January - December 2024 in each of the counties 4KIDS serves.

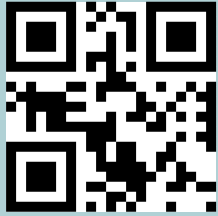

# Understanding The Need

## 6-10

Kids are removed from their homes every day in our community due to abuse, neglect, or abandonment and placed in foster care.



## 80%

Of kids in foster care have significant mental health issues

## 2X MORE LIKELY

Kids who have experienced foster care are twice as likely to suffer from PTSD compared to a US war veteran.



## 81%

Of the young men who age out of foster care become incarcerated.

## 71%

Of young women who age out of foster care experience a pregnancy before they turn 21. Half of those babies will end up in foster care.



## 97%

Of young adults who age out of foster care face chronic poverty.

## 90%

Of youth with 5+ foster placements will enter the justice system



## 60%

of young trafficking survivors are estimated to have been in foster care at some point in their lives.

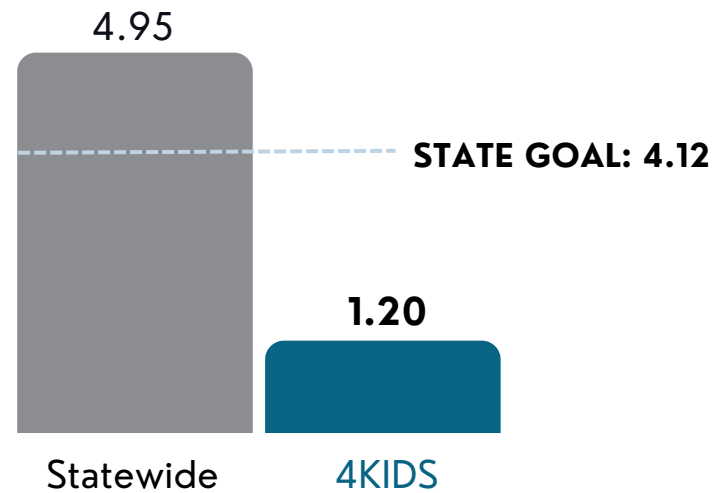
